Teaching and Learning News

As we collectively continue to focus on reading, let me share the following words of advice from The Primary English Teaching Association of Australia:

Learning to read

What we need to know

Reading begins at a very early age when children start to take notice of the print that surrounds them and the talk that includes them. Children begin to engage with reading and writing experiences that attract their attention and interest before they go to school. Children notice street signs, and quickly learn to recognise signs that are of importance to them. They pay attention to books they like and often insist on many re-readings of their favourites.

Talk is a key to literacy learning. Children need opportunities to interact. It is in the context of engaged conversations that children expand their vocabularies, increase their understandings of the world, learn about themselves, and learn the nuances of the language and effective communication. Rich dialogue with your child is key to developing their oral language skills and in turn their ability to be successful readers and writers.

Children require the opportunity to make decisions about the books they choose to read. It is essential that there are lots of books in the home and that they are readily available. Create a book-flood by borrowing weekly from the local library, buying from garage sales, finding supermarket specials, or even by making your own.

Look at how books are stored in the home. Are the books visible or tucked out of sight? Do the children have a bed light to read at night? Keep introducing children to different kinds of books — humorous books, books with beautiful illustrations, rhyming books, pop-up books, electronic books, factual texts, recipes, letters.... and the list goes on. With your children, visit places such as the local library, markets and bookstores to find books that are interesting and fun to share. The number of books, the care of books, and the storage of books are all messages regarding how books and reading are valued in this household.

Be the model and let them see how much you enjoy reading.

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SCHOOL CROSSING SUPERVISOR

CASUAL POSITION VACANT

A casual position exists for a School Crossing Supervisor at Pimpama State Primary College.

The hours of work for the School Crossing Supervisor **may** be up to an Hour and a Half on any school day in *all weather conditions*.

Commencement of work for the successful applicant is dependent on:

- The favourable outcome of a health assessment carried out by a duly qualified Medical Practitioner according to the guidelines in the "Notes for Medical Practitioner" on the School Crossing Supervisor Scheme Health Assessment Form;
- The applicant either hold a current Blue Card or be eligible to submit an application for a Blue Card to the Commission for Blue Card Services. An applicant will not be employed by the Department of Transport and Main Roads unless they meet this criterion.

Department of Transport of Main Roads will **organise and fund** both Medical and Blue Card for selected applicant.
